Frequently Asked Questions**

What is the cost of the program?

Student Cost – Early Bird Registration (valid until October 6, 2017) – \$495.00* Standard Rate – \$550.00*

Non-Student Cost – Early Bird Registration (valid until October 6, 2017) – \$795.00 Standard Rate – \$850.00

*Student Verification includes: Student Identification, School Enrollment Verification, or Class Schedule.

What is the deadline to register for the Certificate Program?

The deadline to register is October 27, 2017. Early Bird registration ends on October 6, 2017.

Does the cost of tuition include travel, food, and lodging?

Breakfast and lunch are provided during the week. Dinner is provided on the first night. You are responsible for all of your own travel and lodging.

Where will classes be held?

Classes will be held at the Tribal Office of Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation.

Frequently Asked Questions

Are there any books required?

The CTC will provide the textbook that will be used for the program. Course materials are developed by instructors and will be provided to you in class.

How long does it take to complete the program and receive a certificate?

Four days.

What days and times are the classes?

Classes will be held from Monday, November 6 to Thursday, November 9, 2017 from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm. We have an evening welcoming event planned for Monday, November 6th at the Yocha Dehe Golf Club.

What classes are provided and who will be teaching the classes?

Topics include: California Indian History, Historical Trauma, Tribal Sovereignty, Sovereign Immunity, Federal Indian Law & Policy, State Power Over Indian Affairs, Robert's Rules of Order, Ethical Decision-Making, and more.

We have tailored each class to include experienced leaders and experts of the field to instruct and lead the classes. Tribal elders, Tribal leaders, Tribal professionals, Federal Indian Law attorneys, and respected community members are providing their knowledge and expertise to this Certificate Program.

Are there any pre-requisites to take the Certificate Program?

There are no pre-requisites or educational requirements to attend this Certificate Program.

Is this an accredited Certificate Program?

No. This Certificate Program is unaccredited and does not offer college credits or continuing education units at this time.

What is the late registration policy?

We will accept on-site registration if the Program is not full, but please register beforehand to guarantee a space in the Certificate Program.

Will we be provided with directions to class sites?

Yes. Directions will be provided to you in your welcome packet.

What is your cancellation and refund policy?

You may cancel your registration and receive a full refund up to fourteen (14) days before the start of the Program. Those paying on PayPal may be subject to a small refund fee. If you choose to cancel your registration less than two weeks prior, the California Tribal College will give you a credit to use for future certificate programs.
